## WHY DID WE DO THIS PROJECT?

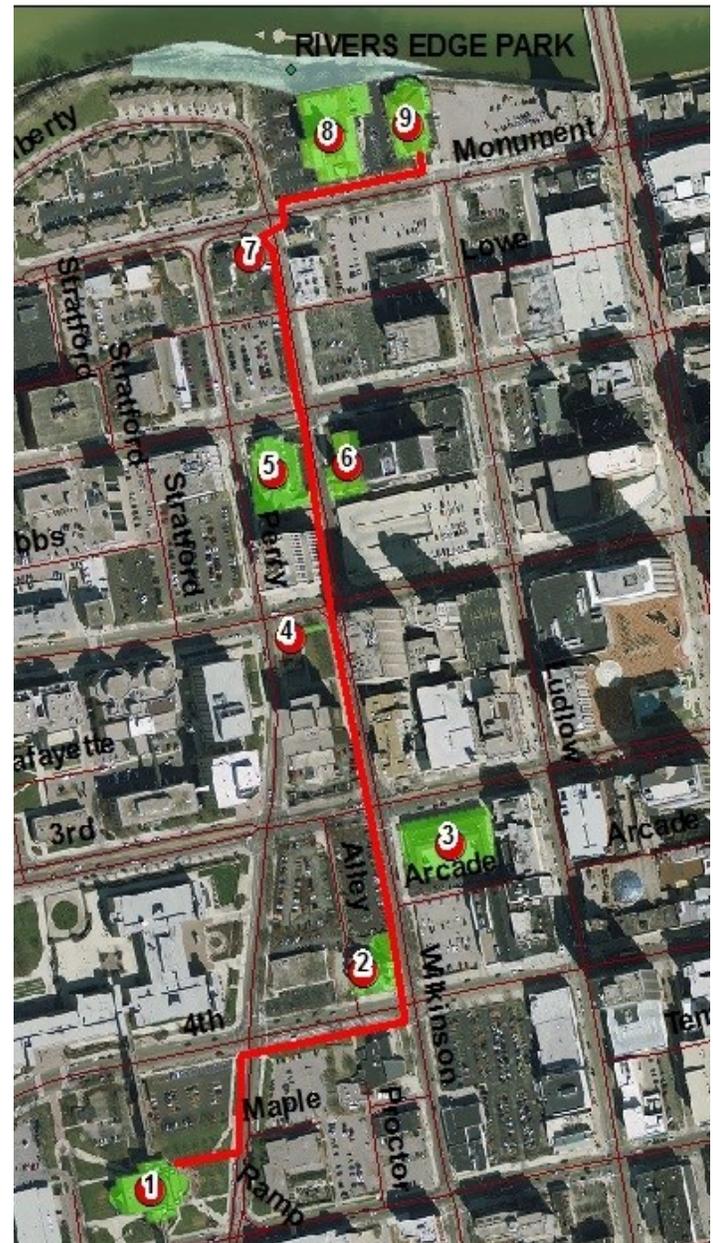

## LEARNING OBJECTIVE

(1) **Sinclair Community College:** Sinclair's first seven buildings (there are now 20+ buildings) were opened to students in 1972.

(2) **Sacred Heart Church:** This Church was erected in 1988. It features extravagant stained glass windows, a copper dome, and a limestone facade.

(3) **The Old Post Office/ Federal Building:** was built in 1915 with a neo-classic revival feel. Giving the nickname of: "The Grecian Lady of Third

(4) **Hearts Hot Dogs:** sits directly in front of the federal court building from 10-3pm Monday through Friday. They offer Chicago style hot dogs and other lunch favorites.

(5) **Westminster Presbyterian Church:** was completed in 1926. It is best known for the beautiful stained glass Tiffany windows and their traditional Christmas eve services.

(6) **First Lutheran Church:** is Dayton's oldest Lutheran Church. Originally founded in a small store room on Main St in 1839. It was finally erected in 1906.

(7) **Dayton Peace Museum:** was founded in 2004. It was the second peace museum to be established in the United States. The building it resides in dates back to 1876.

(8) **The Old YMCA:** The impressively large building was known as the second largest YMCA in the world when it was built in 1908. It is now "The landing" a luxury apartment complex.

(9) **First Baptist Church of Dayton:** It was completed in 1918. At one point they had over 7,500 members. this was also, the location of Orville Wrights funeral.

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
